## Breast cancer risk linked to smoking history in younger women

Smoking a pack of cigarettes daily for a decade or more was linked to a 60% increased likelihood of developing estrogen receptor-positive breast cancer, according to a study of younger women published in the journal <u>Cancer</u>. Compared with nonsmokers, women who reported ever smoking cigarettes had about a 30% greater risk of having any form of breast cancer. <u>Reuters</u> (2/10)
