Groups Pushing For Legislation On Breast Density Information.

A <u>Miami Herald</u> (7/1, Herald) article reports on breast density. After "a mammogram, the radiologist reading the X-rays determines the density of your breasts by placing them on a scale of one (least dense) to four (most dense) using the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data System (BI-RADS) of the American College of Radiology." The article points out that certain groups are advocating for legislation requiring physicians to share breast density information with patients who have received a mammogram.
