Rate of prophylactic bilateral mastectomy rising

The percentage of women diagnosed with unilateral breast cancer who chose to have prophylactic contralateral mastectomy tripled from 2002 to 2012, researchers reported in the Annals of Surgery. Ten-year survival, however, was roughly the same as for women who chose breast-conserving surgery or unilateral mastectomy. More than 86% of women who test positive for a BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutation choose double mastectomy, and recent research found that more than half the women who test negative for a mutation choose double mastectomy anyway.
